Now that Christmas is over, many are weeks deep into their New Year's diets. In an effort to trim off the extra pounds the holidays added, some are slugging through one of any number of eating plans designed to reduce intake and maximize weight loss. May God bless and help all involved in these endeavors.

Although all of the Christmas leftovers have now been thrown out or frozen, some of the lessons we can learn from them linger with us just like the pounds they added to our bodies. One of those involves the different seasonings and spices included in our various dishes.

Not only at Christmas, but throughout the year, chefs, bakers, and cooks incorporate a wide variety of ingredients to the offerings they prepare. Some of these components are major, like the ham in baked ham or the chicken in fried chicken, while others are more minor such as the cinnamon or nutmeg in cookies. Although used in very small quantities, their inclusion contributes significantly to the final flavor of the finished entrée.

This culinary truth reminds us of the value of each human being. Some individuals become the star of whatever dish they may be involved in while others are less obvious but no less important. Even in small doses, salt can transform a dish and greatly enhance its flavor. In a similar fashion, too much salt can ruin even the finest steak.

Some people bemoan the minor roles they play at their jobs, in their communities, or even in their churches. They admire those with more exposure or involvement and yearn for such "usefulness" while failing to appreciate the vital part each person plays. To paraphrase Paul's words in I Corinthians 12:18, "But in fact God has arranged the ingredients in the recipe, every one of them, just as He wanted them to be." As the Master Chef, God knows the exact proportions in which our gifts are needed to create the perfect flavors.

One other truth we can apply from this is that each recipe is different. While some cookies require no cinnamon, others require more. So too, while our role in one area or time in our life may be lesser, there may be another area or time when the Chef will see fit to add what we offer in greater quantities. Submission to His skill and wisdom is what's critically important for each dish to be delicious.

Imagine what might happen if the cumin had a mind of its own and was determined to override the will of the cook. Instead of being sprinkled in sparingly, it defiantly pushes off its lid and dumps itself into the pot. Not only will this upset the chef, but such an action would ruin the flavor and destroy his plan for a tasty delicacy.

In that same passage of I Corinthians 12 where Paul is discussing the importance of every member, he indicates that some spiritual gifts that may seem minor are indispensable. In a similar fashion we can understand that it's because some spices are so powerful and strong that only small amounts are necessary. We may grumble about the tiny quantity our Chef uses us in when our significant flavor and strength would overwhelm the other ingredients if used too abundantly.

Writing in Touchstone Magazine, Senior Editor S. M. Hutchens says, "We who are preoccupied with being something, of achieving significance, must remember that the greatness to which we are called is nothing more or less than being what we were made to be and doing what we were made to do." In small quantities or large, everyone is important.

If you're on earth that means you're in God's pantry and that He has a plan and a purpose for your life. He's in the business of creating the most delicious dishes by utilizing what each of us "bring to the table." Let us submit to His recipe and will.

Special Opportunity To Support Antioch With Tax Advantages For You:

If you are over 70½ years of age, the tax laws allow you to donate all or part of your IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) to a church or charity and you won't have to pay any taxes on the amount you give. A Qualifying Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows you to donate up to \$100,000 per year directly to your church or qualified charity from your IRA and exclude it from your income, and thus your tax liability. The donation has to go directly from your IRA to your church or charity and cannot come to you and then be given. It must go directly. The money or stocks must be drawn directly from an IRA and must go directly from the IRA institution (Schwab, Fidelity, Wells Fargo, etc) to the church or charity. You, the account holder, must never touch the money.

Example: Jane is an active and generous 73 year old who gives to her church regularly. After retiring a few years back, she has a substantial nest egg in her IRA. The Required Minimum Distribution from her IRA (the minimum amount the government requires her to withdraw and pay taxes on this year) is \$30,000. Jane will use \$20,000 toward her living expenses but wants to donate the rest to her church. She will send the funds directly from her individual IRA to her church to make her donation. Since the funds go directly from her IRA to the church, it never hits her bank account and therefore it is not included in her annual adjusted gross income, thus giving her a nice charitable deduction and she is able to advance Jesus' work as well. If you have questions, speak to your financial advisor or tax consultant.

Pastor George's Back Story on how the paintings came to be

Several months ago, a couple came to me with a cash donation for the kitchen and fellowship hall that they wished to remain anonymous. Since our kitchen appliances have been gradually upgraded over the years, there weren't any glaring items needed. As I prayed for God to show us how this money could best be used, the Holy Spirit opened my eyes to see that there were several gifted artists in the congregation and He gave me the idea to approach them about possibly painting various scenes from Jesus' life.

These paintings, if the artists agreed to paint them, would be hung on the wall in the fellowship hall above the mailboxes. As I sought God's guidance, it became clear that these scenes should all point someone to Jesus and the free forgiveness and salvation He has purchased for us with His blood. Since our fellowship hall is used by many people both in and out of the congregation, this would be an opportunity to share the Gospel through visual art with some who may never be here to hear a sermon.

The scenes were chosen to reflect Jesus' death and resurrection which are the heart of the Gospel. But since Antioch has such a large ministry to children, a scene depicting Jesus with children was also ideal. In addition, since our Love Feasts act out service by washing feet in obedience to Jesus' commands, and since Antioch members serve others in many different ways, a depiction of Jesus washing feet was a gimmie. Finally, Jesus' role as our Good Shepherd seemed to be a fifth theme to portray.

The artists chose which of these scenes they would paint and while each artist would donate their artistic gifts, the cash gift could be used to pay for materials as needed. Since all artists provided their own materials, no money was needed for this but Sister Kay Witt knew how to have artwork reproduced on large banners that could be uniform in size and hung on the wall. Although not terribly expensive, part of the gift was used to do exactly this and Sister Kay took care of getting the paintings made into these banners once they were all complete.

At the time, I had no idea God had in mind using these paintings for our Advent themes but as they were being completed early this fall at the time I was contemplating topics for Advent, He made it clear. And so, thanks to each artist and to the original donation, these paintings have become a reality and will be hung above the mailboxes pointing all to Jesus! Kay Witt (Good Shepherd), Anonymous (Jesus washing feet), Shelly Miller (Jesus' crucifixion), Wendy Boyd (Jesus with children), and Roberta Demski (Jesus' resurrection) Each artist has her own unique style and talent but all are exquisite and all raise our thoughts, minds, and hearts to our Savior and help us glorify Him! Thanks so much to each artist who has used her gift to glorify God and help all of us worship Him throughout the Advent season and to point others to Him for years to come. Blessings to all!

My Inspiration for Jesus and the Lamb

I am the lamb in this painting!

My inspiration for the painting of Jesus and the Lamb comes from Luke 15: 3-7. It's the story of how Jesus leaves the 99 sheep and goes in search of the one that was lost. He then joyfully carries it home, rejoicing that He has found the lost sheep.

It's my life's story. I was the lamb. I didn't know that I was lost – I'd heard about Jesus, but didn't really know him. Then, one day, a young lady knocked on my dorm room door and explained that I could know Him in a personal way. Immediately, I knew that this was what I was looking for since I was a child. I asked Jesus into my heart as my Savior that very day. I have never been the same since.

I have been an artist most of my life and have painted many wonderful pieces. This one though, came straight from my heart and is my best work to date! To my delight, it has had a profound effect on many who have seen it. It helps to remind people of how much Jesus loves them! He is not mad at you. He loves you and so desires to be your Savior and friend!

If you want to know Jesus, stop right now and ask Him into your heart. You will never be the same again. I promise.

Inspirations for the Banner Paintings

I am deeply honored to have been given the opportunity to create a painting of Jesus' crucifixion to hang in banner form at Antioch. The creation of No Greater Love has been the most challenging—and the most spiritually transformative—experience of my artistic journey. As you read the story behind this piece, I believe you'll see what I came to understand very clearly: this artwork is God's work. I was simply the vessel He chose to use to create it.

This painting began, as all things should, with prayer. I asked God for guidance and, soon after, received an email from Pastor George containing scriptures related to the crucifixion. My starting point was to immerse myself in research—reading and rereading those passages and studying the writings of Biblical scholars. One detail that struck me was that the charge against Jesus would likely have been written in three languages—Hebrew, Latin, and Greek—and nailed above His head for all to read. Wanting the painting to be both Biblically and historically accurate, I decided to include such a sign in the artwork.

As I prayed through the composition, God impressed on me the importance of emphasizing the blood of Christ. To do that, I felt led to paint the entire piece in monotone, reserving red only for Jesus' blood—the very blood that washes us clean. Once I settled on a close-up composition showing Jesus on the cross, His body wounded and bleeding, I called Pastor George to talk through the concept. With his blessing, I began.

I sketched the scene onto the canvas and started painting the black-and-white layers: Jesus on the cross, the sign above Him, rays of light breaking through dark and stormy clouds. Though the monotone layers took many hours, they flowed from my brush with an ease I've never experienced. It became unmistakably clear that God's hand was guiding mine. When that portion was complete, I stepped back, grateful and relieved. I thought the hardest part was behind me, when in reality, it was just beginning.

After letting the first layers of paint dry for several days, I added the first brushstrokes of wounds and blood. When I stepped back to check my progress from a good viewing distance, I felt unsettled. Something wasn't right. I wasn't sure if I was bothered by the colors of red that I had mixed or by the technique with which I applied them to the canvas. Regardless, it was all wrong. Doubt rushed in. I questioned the design, the choice of completing most of the piece in monotone, and even my ability as an artist. I cleaned my brushes and walked away. The painting sat untouched on my easel for days. Each time I looked at it, the weight of frustration and self-doubt grew heavier. I finally moved it out of sight.

Then came Palm Sunday. Pastor George spoke about how Jesus carried not only the physical weight of the cross, but the full weight of humanity's sin. On the drive home, I found myself thinking about how much weight I had added to Jesus' burden, and suddenly, I realized why I couldn't bring myself to finish the painting. My guilt had become a barrier. Subconsciously, I was translating the act of sinning to the act of painting wounds and blood on Jesus' body. Symbolically, I was adding more weight to that cross with every brushstroke I placed on the canvas. Along with that realization came another...I was under spiritual attack by the enemy. Of course, he didn't want me to finish this painting that would glorify God. So, he used my guilt and shame to plant a seed of doubt that only God's word could destroy.

The moment I got home, I went straight to my studio and placed the painting back on my easel. I finished the final layer of wounds and blood on Good Friday morning. God's timing could not have been more perfect.

My prayer is that No Greater Love serves as a powerful reminder of the unimaginable suffering Jesus endured for us. He gave His life for us—the least we can do is honor Him with ours.

Pastor George and Nancy, thank you for inviting me to be a part of this meaningful project. Above all, thank You, God, for guiding my hands and my heart as I strive to glorify You through every piece I create.



How Can I Be Saved?

It is very easy to have your sins forgiven, be saved, and go to heaven. There are three basic steps:

1. Admit. Admit to God that you are a sinner (that you have disobeyed Him and His plan for your life). Romans 3:23 "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

2. Believe. Believe that God loves you and that He sent His Son, Jesus, to take the penalty for our sin and to pay our price. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

3. Confess. Confess with your mouth that "Jesus is Lord" of all and that God raised Him from the dead. Romans 10:9 "If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

Just pray right now, tell God that you are a sinner, and ask Him to forgive you through Jesus' blood. Tell Him you want Jesus to be Lord, the Leader of your life.

If you have never prayed to God or it has been a long time it may be hard to know where to start. While you can tell God whatever is on your heart, the following prayer may help you get started if you don't know where to begin.

"Dear God, I know I am a sinner and I want to stop. I'm sorry for my sins and I'm asking you to forgive me because of Jesus' death on the cross. I believe Jesus is Your Son and I believe You raised Him from the dead. I want Him to save me and to lead me. Thank you for doing this. I give myself to you. In Jesus Name, Amen"
